#### 600. A German Panorama -- Doug Casey:

(cont'd from Newsketter # 167)
On May 23rd, 1949, the Federal Republic of Germany
(West Germany) was proclaimed and stamps were issued by the Republic on September 7th of that year. Eventually these replaced stamps issued by the American, British and French for use in their Zones.



Similarly the German Democratic Republic ( East Germany ) was established on October 7th, 1949, and released it's first issue on October 9th of that year. Likewise they too eventually replaced the earlier stamps issued by the Russian occupying forces.



ruled jointly by all four of the major powers. It was divided into four sectors and ruled, along with the rest of Germany, by the Allied Control Council. On March 20th,1948, the last meeting of the Control Council was held, and on July 1st, 1948, the Russians withdrew from the four power control of Berlin. Up to June 21st, 1948, (date of currency reform in the American, British & French Zones), common issues had been valid for use in all Zones. Now with the difference in value of the mark between East and West, it became necessary to issue new stamps. The first stamp issued for West Berlin was an overprint on September 1st, 1948. Later in 1949, the word "BERLIN" was incorporated into the design. This practice has continued to the present day with stamps still being issued for use in the Western sector of the city.

This pretty little cover below was sent on May 23rd, 1940, 8-pm from Preston Lancs., to Charlottetown, P.E.I. Canada. This was 17 days after the first day of use. The franking is the ½D green and the 2D orange centenary of the first adhesive rate and this paid the surface rate to Canada.

Dear Don; Your lettle gem indeed proved to be a "conversation piece". The "experts "and my "sources "think it probably is a fiscal as you indicate. It may also have been issued by a European country that no longer exists in that it is now part of another country in Europe. The paper would seem to be laid or woven, probably the former. The late 19th century is probably the date it was issued and the 3 - 16 is the date of issue.

handling if mailed to purchaser under serarate cover.



The really good news is the response to the Court of Honor this early ( remember these amounts are on March 5th date ) about 15 frames is a good possibility for the Court of Honor

--- Frames: Those members requiring frames should arrange for pick-up with Bob Vaison at 422-4828. Frames cannot be delivered so if you can't pick them up, make sure to be at the Hotel at 6PM Friday, April 11th, with your entry ready for framing.

--- Set-Up: Members are requested to bring their frames and/or entries to the Lord Nelson Hotel as close to 6PM as possible on Friday, April 11th. We hope to have the judging done that evening and can only do that if the frames are in position.

- --- Club Table: Hembers are requested to spend an hour or so at the Club Table greeting the visitors that will be attending. We need two members for each hour the Exhibition is open starting at 10Am and ending at 5PM. Items available at the table this year will be an information sheet, membership forms and the door prizes. Anyone interested in sitting at the Club Table are requested to give Dr. Margaret DeWolfe a call and volunteer your services.
- --- Novice Judges: Any members interested in becoming a philatelic judge are invited to take the first step by becoming a Novice Judge. Those interested should contact Marilyn Murphy at 453-4220. It should be noted that only those members willing to put in a couple years should apply as this is just the first step. The second step is attending the travelling Road Show put on by the Royal Philatelic Society of Canada whenever it arrives in this part of the country. This year, as in the past, Novice Judges will accompany the official Judges as they select the Award winners before the Exhibition opens.
- --- Award Presentations: The Chairman of the Judges will give a talk regarding the quality of the entries in this year's Exhibition and introduce the Award Winners at the banquet. If judging takes place as planned on Friday night, the awards may even be engraved in time for actual presentation at the banquet. If not, the presentations will take place at the May meeting.
