New National Stamp Collection at **Canadian Museum of Civilization**

A new permanent exhibit, Reflections of Canada -The National Stamp Collection, was inaugurated at the Canadian Museum of Civilization on July 1, 2002. The Collection is an exhibition that presents all the stamps ever issued in Canada, including those issued by the provinces before they joined Confederation. This project is the result of an unprecedented three-way partnership between the Canadian Museum of Civilization, Canada Post and the National Archives of Canada.

"Not only can visitors admire this beautiful collection for the first time, but the exhibition provides a unique opportunity to revisit Canadian history through the 2,300 stamps in the national stamp collection," said Dr. Victor Rabinovitch. President and CEO of the Canadian Museum of Civilization Corporation.

The stamps are windows on Canada's past and present. The exhibition explores eight themes treated in the stamps' artwork: history, culture, economy, environment, symbols, society, philately and sports. Some of these stamps have become icons over the years, such as the 1929 Bluenose, a celebrated favourite of collectors. Many significant stamps are explored in depth in the exhibition.

Visitors can obtain more information on each stamp by consulting the National Archives of Canada's Web site on computer monitors in the exhibition. They can also view historical vignettes on videos produced by the Historica Foundation of Canada. The Canadian Museum of Civilization will offer a special school programme in which children can discover the world of philately.

Reflections of Canada will be on permanent display at the Canadian Postal Museum located in the Caanaian Museum of Civilization.

Austro-Hungarian Lettersheet by Michael Peach

In the October Newsletter, Dennis Bedley had a copy of an old folded lettersheet, possibly written in German. I have been looking at it.

The letter reflects the European political situation as it was in the middle of the 19th century. It was mailed within the old Austro-Hungarian Empire in 1859. At that time the only



stamps in use were those of Austria, as Hungary did not issue stamps until 1871. The red 5 Kr. Austrian stamp, Scott 9, is cancelled with a Szikszó CDS 27 August 1859. Szikszó is in Hungary. It was sent a distance of just over 50 km to Cashau (Kashau in modern German) which is now named Kosice, a city in Slovakia. In 1859 it was part of the Austro-Hungarian Empire. The date of the receipt of the lettersheet is noted in the script on the letter, 28 Aug (1)859. The letter was written in German in the old style German script.

There are a few words missing in the text. It was sent by Nicholaus von Vrubingy to the Respected R.R. Finance Procurator in Cashau. It concerns a summons from a judge received on 22 August to appear on the same date about the arrears of interest payment to a Foundation on a credit note. It is claimed that the payment should be directed to Michael von Vrubingi (? same *family*) living in Liptau(er) County (*Liptov* or Liptó, now in Slovakia), as the beneficiary of Ludwig Jacob (?). This also involves the R.R. Finance Procurator of Döbling (Vienna), concerning a credit note of Ludwig Jacob, dated 1822, which has long been repaid and on which the interest has been paid. - Dated 27 Aug (1)1859 by Nicholaus von Vrubingy.

The name Lipauer is associated with a soft cheese originating in Hungary, and a cheese spread made of Liptauer, or a cream cheese substitute, and seasonings.

Canada Post announces 2003 commemorative stamp program

On September 12, 2002, the Honourable André Ouellet, President and Chief Executive Officer of Canada Post, Ottawa, announced the commemorative stamp program for 2003. The selection of the coming year will mark anniversaries for the Queen, six Canadian universities and the National Library as well as the end of the Korean War. Recognition will be given to volunteer firefighters, Canadian astronauts, the World Road Cycling Championships and the Canadian Rangers. The Lunar New Year, NHL All-Stars, and the Tourist Attractions, all popular themes from previous years, will again be included in the program.

The 2003 program:

New Year of the Ram (January 3) A domestic-rate stamp and an international rate souvenir sheet to celebrate the Lunar New Year - February 1, 2003.

NHL All-Stars (January 18) Six new domestic-rate stamps in the popular "hockey hereos" series.

University Anniversaries - 150th anniversaries of Bishop's University in Lennoxville, Quebec and Saint Francis Xavier University in Antigonish, Nova Scotia; 125th anniversaries of the University of Western Ontario and the University of

Montreal; and, the centennials of the University of Guelph's MacDonald Institute and the University of Victoria will be commemorated with individual domestic-rate stamps released in 2003.

Audubon Collection (February) Artwork of renowned naturalist John James Audubon (17851851), who painted and wrote about the birds of North America, will be released on four domestic-rate stamps and one U.S. rate

Canadian Rangers (March) The military reservists who have been patrolling Canada's coasts and northern territories for more than 50 years are to be commemorated with a single issue.

American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association in Canada (March 25) A domestic -rate stamp will be issued to mark th 75th anniversary of the an association that promotes education, philanthropy and civic responsibility. The AHEPA is the largest Greek-American organization in the world, with chapters in the United States, Canada, Australia and Greece

Jean-Paul Riopelle (May) The works of celebrated artist Jean-Paul Riopelle, who passed away in March 2002 will be honoured with a souvenir sheet of three stamps (domestic , U.S. and international rates).

Volunteer Firefighters (May) This single issue release will be timed to coincide with ROYAL*2003*ROYALE, the 75th annual convention of the Royal Philatelic Society of Canada, in Hanover, Ontario from May 30 June 1.

Royal Coronation (June 2) A special stamp issued to coincide with the 50^{th} anniversary of the Queen's coronation. As was the case with last year's stamp, sufficient quantities will be printed to ensure it remains on sale throughout the year.

Tourist Attractions - The 2003 Tourist Attractions stamp series will feature more eye-catching Canadian destinations. Five stamps each will be available at the U.S. and international rates.

Pedro da Silva (July 9) The stamp commemorates the first official Canadian mail messenger, a Portuguese, as well as the

50th anniversary of officially-sponsored Portuguese immigration.

For the Healing of the World (July 21) A single stamp will be issued on July 21 to coincide with the start of the Lutheran World Federation Tenth Assembly in Winnipeg. The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada will host the event, the first time it has been held in Canada.

Korean Veterans - A single issue to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Armistice that brought an end to fighting in Korea, and to honour those Canadian service personnel who gave their lives. The stamp was developed in response to many requests by Canada's veterans.

World Road Cycling Championships (October) A single domestic rate stamp will be issued in to coincide with the event will take place in Hamilton, Ontario.

National Library (October) Canada Post books famous authors for world tour To mark the 50th anniversary of the National Library a library dedicated to preserving Canada's published heritage Canada Post will issue a set of stamps featuring some of our country's most celebrated authors.

Stamp Collecting Month Celebrates Canadian Astronauts (October) A set of eight stamps, issued to kick off stamp collecting month, pays tribute to Canadian astronauts.

National Plants - Thailand Joint Issue (October) Canada Post and Thailand Post team up for a joint issue featuring national plants, timed to coincide with an international stamp show in Thailand.

Christmas 2003 (October) The domestic, U.S. and international rate stamps will be available in plenty of time to mail those Christmas packages.

Gold and Silver Stamp Sheetlet on Lunar New Year Animals Snake / Horse Issue Date: 9 February 2002

The first Gold and Silver Stamp Sheetlet was issued in 2001 to commemorate the opening of the Hong Kong 2001 Stamp Exhibition. It was welcomed by philatelists for its special printing technique - the use of genuine gold and silver hot stamping. The sheetlet featured the Lunar New Year animals which are key symbols of festival celebrations at Chinese New Year. Chinese people are fond of having souvenir items made up of genuine gold and silver, especially if they include Lunar New Year animals, at festival time.

This sheetlet, which is the second issue in the series, consists of the two consecutive Lunar New Year special stamps, Snake and Horse, at face values of \$50 each, to celebrate the commencement of the new year. The stamps, depicting the Snake and Horse, have been embossed and hot-foiled respectively with genuine 24-carat gold / 99.9% pure silver, and genuine 22-carat gold / 99.9% pure silver. A certificate of authenticity is included with the sheetlet. The design of this sheetlet is meant to symbolise the grand and prosperous mood of festivals, especially those marking Chinese New Year.

These stamp products include stamp sheetlet, presentation pack, souvenir cover and serviced souvenir cover (available at the 38 philatelic offices on the issue day only).

Newfoundland and Labrador -New Postal Symbol



Royal 2004 Logo Chosen

The logo for Royal*2004*Royale was recently chosen at a meeting of the show's organizers. The design (above) depicts an image of the Old Town Clock as a focal point that also represents an 'A' in the text for The Clock, which is easily Halifax. identifiable with Halifax, represents the city's rich history - an underlying theme in the show with respect to the 250th anniversary of Canada's first Post Office at Halifax. The boldness of the text in both the words Halifax and Royal/Royale 2004 exemplify the location and the event. Stylized perforations on the top and bottom outline the internal design, bringing together the stamp theme. Jeff Parks, who created the conceptual design for the Novapex 2002 cancel, designed the Royal 2004 logo. A logo designed by Michael Peach, based on an early Halifax Nova Scotia cancel from J.J. MacDonald's book, was also well received and may be used as a cachet, cancel or in other appropriate ways.

Errors Offered at Auction

You asked for it, you got it! As soon as Marty started to sell the Royal 2004 pins, club members asked him if there were any "errors" available. Thus prodded by his fellow collectors, Marty examined his remaining stock of pins and discovered, to his delight and amazement, about a half dozen true errors on the pins. Most of the errors are of the "Missing Ink" variety, but one unique and spectacular item has been "over-inked" and is missing several letters from the word "ROYALE". These finds will be up for auction (at a reserve above their "issue" value) at the November meeting. Don't miss this once in a life-time opportunity to own a rare error. And of course if you have not yet purchased your "regular" issue pin, bring along a few extra baubles for barter (the monetary type is most appreciated). Stamp Collecting and the Internet by Jeff Parks

I have been kicking around the idea of writing a monthly article on interesting stamp and stamp collecting resources that I have found while surfing the web for some time now. Well, as the famous slogan of Nike says, it's time to "just do it".

The Universal Postal Union through its World Association for the Development of Philately have published a numbering system on the internet. The aim of the system is to create a database of all legal postage stamps issued by UPU member countries including their territories and dependancies. So far over 100 postal administrations have signed up. The application has commenced with stamps issued since January 1, 2002.

The web site for individual stamps contains an image of the stamp, technical data and a unique serial number (WNS number) that consists of a standard 2-letter country code, a three digit sequential number followed by a dot and a two digit year (i.e. CA013.02 represents the 13th stamp issued by Canada in 2002).

"The goal is for the WNS to become the central point of reference against which stamp issues can be verified, supporting the legal philatelic market by endorsing those stamps that are genuine.


Only those postage stamps that, once received by the International Bureau (IB) of the UPU have undergone the process of verification of authenticity and registration will be attributed a WNS number and added to the WNS website, which is published in English and French.(www.wnsstamps.ch or www.upu.int)

The WNS website is therefore a reference tool and a control, by omission, of stamps that have been issued illegally and labels that are claimed to be stamps. The WNS is one of the tools the UPU has introduced, helping the Posts and the philatelic market as a whole to combat this problem on or after that date."
