#### Some Nova Scotian Philatelists: G. Collins Baugild, FRPSC by Beverlie A. Clark\*

G. Collins Baugild, 1906-1992, was born in the famous fishing town of Lunenburg, Nova Scotia. He attended local school in Lunenburg until his family moved to Halifax in 1918. He later attended the Nova Scotia Technical School specializing in drafting, woodcarving and etching. At the age of 18 years, he joined the Maritime Telegraph and Telephone Company Limited, retiring at the age of 62.

He commenced collecting stamps when very young, in Lunenburg, by obtaining stamps from vessels returning from the fishing grounds of Nova Scotia and Newfoundland. At that time, these vessels also often engaged in rum running around different parts of the world. His collecting interests centered on British West Indies, Canada and Great Britain, along with the postal history and stamps of Nova Scotia. His particular interest was imperf. material.

In 1923 he joined the Nova Scotia Stamp Club in Halifax, and for many years has exhibited his Nova Scotia Pence and Cents issues with proofs, colour trials and covers in the club's annual exhibitions, receiving numerous gold medal awards. Additional hobbies are his interest in antique postcards and his collection of coins, which he shares with his son.

Always a great supporter, and a member of the RPSC for over half a century, he assisted in the success of the RPSC conventions held in Halifax in the early 1940s and 1965. He was elected a fellow in 1987.

A few years ago he was employed by the Nova Scotia Archives to rearrange and write up a collection donated by a prominent local businessman who was a principal member of a Halifax firm specializing in fine china. This collection is beautifully written up with his drafting expertise and is one of the prime collections of fine material held by the Nova Scotia Archives.

#### New Issue Stamp Posters A Thank You

In the past few NSSC Newsletters there has been a notice for donations for the youth area at Royal 2004. A few weeks ago I had an enquiry from David Jones in Ottawa about what I really wanted or could use. He offered, and I quickly accepted, a number of "new issue posters", which could be used to 'decorate' the youth area and then serve as giveaways at the end of the show. These posters arrived safely along with a little background info on these posters which David asked that I might share with club members by means of the Newsletter.

David has collected post office documents since 1955. Posters were issued for each new stamp and one copy was sent to each and every post office. During the war years, paper being in short supply, these posters would have been recycled. In later years Postmasters were ordered to destroy the posters after use. They were often taped or stapled to a notice board causing deterioration in quality and very little interest has been shown in Canada in posters. In the US it is a more popular collecting interest.

He says that: "the collecting challenge has been exacerbated by stamp release frequency. Until the mid 1950's Canada issued only three or four new stamps a year. By the time we get into the 70's we are seeing 15 posters a year. I spent a lot of time visiting post offices! Often I was too late: many clerks and Postmasters destroy "old" material with fanatical zeal.

Despite these challenges, since 1955 I have assembled F to VF copies of 99% of the new issue posters. I have VF copies of all the new issue 'handouts' that were available to post office customers (called P.S. 14's for some reason). Further I hold a great deal of literature, including graphic and text notices, instructions to postmasters and

miscellaneous other material. My collection encompasses almost 500 Canadian new issue posters. I also hold a smattering of such material from the U.S., Bermuda and the U.K."

- 1. Canadian new issue stamp posters (illustrated announcements) began in 1935 with Scott 211-216. Printed on glossy paper in black/white, this poster gave no day of issue, was issued under the authority of the 'Acting Deputy Postmaster General'. Three years later, the date of issue started to appear. Omission of D.O.I. would return 36 years later when it was left off Scott 572-3 poster.
- 2. Before illustrated announcements, information about new issues came out in 'department orders and circulars', 'notices to postmasters', and 'weekly bulletins'. I have Department Order No.2 issued 1 March 1868. It was the second communiqué to postmasters after Confederation. It contained rate notifications and an announcement of a pending issue in denominations of ½ cent to 15 cents. It may be one of only two or three extant copies.
- 3. In 1956, the P.O.D. started issuing P.S. 14's to the public. They are small, first in English and French single sheets, then bilingual, folded with an order form attached.

4.Since 1994 P.S. 14's have not been issued. Poster release has been erratic with a bizarre variation in style, size and content.

David also notes "Thank you for allowing me to share my experience with Canadian illustrated announcements. But, having been asked to send in some notes, I can't pass up the opportunity to make an appeal. I desperately want to locate better quality posters for Scott's 231, 289-293 (may

not exist), 395, all of 1962, 410, 401-404, 420-1, 476. I am willing to make attractive trades for these items. On the exchange side, I welcome correspondence and questions. Please e-mail me at


#### **VOLUNTEERS ROYAL 2004**
