Sir Sandford Fleming

Sir Sanford Fleming, the most prominent and original of Canadian engineers, was born at Kirkcaldy, Fife, Scotland, on the January 7, 1827. He attended school there and excelled in mathematics with an inclination amounting almost to a passion. At fourteen he left school and articled as a student of surveying and engineering applying himself to his work with a diligence and a zeal that might be taken as an earnest of the achievements that the future reserved for him. At the age of eighteen, and traveling with his brother David, Fleming set out for Canada, where he was resolved to seek his fortune, arrived at Peterborough in June 1845. The weather on trip from Scotland was so tempestuous that, despairing for his life, he wrote a final message and threw it overboard in a bottle.

Fleming was always searching for broader horizons and greater challenges. His keen intelligence and scientific and artistic ability involved him in many significant accomplishments. In 1852 he was appointed to the engineering staff of the Northern Railway. His promoted rapidly and the young engineer found more offers for his service than he could accept. When the idea of an Intercolonial railway extending from the Atlantic to the Pacific was proposed in 1863, it was decided that a survey should be made by a commission of three engineers. Canada nominated Fleming, and Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and the imperial government accepted him as their

representative. Fleming was appointed sole engineer. Fleming conducted the survey for the first link from Riviere du Loup to Halifax. His outstanding success in this project earned for him the title of engineer-in-chief of the Canadian Pacific Railway.

In 1846, due to political and policy changes in the United Kingdom, it was determined that postal operations in the British North American colonies should operate as independent administrations. The Post Office Act of 1850 moved responsibility for the post office to what was then known as the Canadian Provincial Government beginning on April 6, 1851. The first Postmaster General for the Province of Canada, James Morris, commissioned the design of new stamps to mark the transition. The first stamp was issued on April 23,



1851. A redcoloured imperforate, the Three Pence Beaver, was based on a sketch Fleming

Stamp Oddities



The design of the first stamps of New Caledonia in the southwest Pacific were drawn by Sergeant Triquerat, of the local garrison,

in rough imitation of the current French stamps in 1860. The designs were transferred with a pin to the stone from which the stamps were lithographed.

These stamps were only valid for mail on the island. Outgoing mairequired stamps of New South Wales to be affixed as well. The

> stamps were suppressed in 8 6 2 1 replaced by French colonial stamps. The supply of stamps became exhausted in 1876 and special cachets were applied to outgoing mail.

> New Caledonia had no regular mail service until 1882-3.

The first steamer left Marseille on 23 November 1882 and arrived on 13 January 1883.

The souvenir sheet shown with the Philex France 1999 logo was issued July 3, 1999 for the 140th anniversary of the New Caledonia's first postage stamp. Designer Claude Andreotto.

drew on a napkin while breakfasting with Morris in Toronto. A recent article in CSN by Ian Robertson reports on an upcoming Firby auction of a page from Fleming's notebook dated Monday, February 24, 1851, depicting a "3d Beaver Venetian Red Plate Essay". The handwriting on the sheet states "Breakfasted at Ellah's Hotel with Mr. Rutter and Honble. Jas Morris Post Master General. Designing postage stamps for him." The item is estimated at \$90,000 US.

Fleming had suggested the beaver as a symbol of the industry,

economy and hard work of the C a n a d i a n people. It was a significant departure from contemporary




designs which usually featured the reigning monarch, a statesman, a geometric design or a coat of arms.



The classic beaver design has been featured seven times on a Canadian issue. It first appeared

on the 1851 debutante followed by the 1852 3d stamp on wove paper, the 1858 3d issue, the 1859 five cent, the 1951 15c, and the 1982 stamp-on-stamp for the Canada '82 philatelic exhibition.







A 1908 postcard looking up Octerloney Street, Dartmouth. The first building on the left is the Quaker House and Christ Chruch is in the background. The card was cancelled Dec 30 1908 and mailed to Hazelwood Cottage, North West Arm, Halifax . There used to be cottages in the Edmonds Grounds which borders the North West Arm. So possibly there was a cottage there named Hazelwood.


