


Register for the Royal

The NSSC membership is reminded to get your registration for the Royal in soon. The registration covers the cost of the reception and banquet as well as the seminars that are put on during the show. Don't delay - reserve your space today.

A German airmail letter dated Feb 1944 franked with a blue Luftfeldpost stamp depicting a Junkers 52 Transport plane.. German stamps inscribed DEUTSCHE FELDPOST, (German Fieldpost), or LUFTFELDPOST, (Air Fieldpost), were issued between 1942 and 1944 for use on parcels and letters sent home by troops in the field. Each soldier was given a ration of four stamps until May 1943 when the allowance doubled to eight. Does anyone know the significance of the X across the front, I have seen this on almost every example that I have come across.

Stamp Oddities

The "stamp" depicted here has puzzled countless collectors for several generations. It was produced by Major Brewster Cox Kenyon, a paymaster in the U.S. volunteers in 1898. At that



time the United States was at war with Spain and Major Kenyon used his position in the Army to have a quantity of his "stamps" attached to Army mail. The

U.S. Post Office forced him to stop the practice but for many years after he retired from the Army to become a land speculator in California, Major Kenyon obtained a steady income by selling his army frank stamps to collectors. The stamps are known to exist in rose, blue and brown.

England Rugby Championship Winners - 2




Further to my recent article in the February Newsletter, I have been able to obtain two first day covers with a Rugby School cancellation. These are shown in the figures. Both are signed by Patrick Derham, the Headmaster,

and have the cancellation RUGBY SCHOOL RUGBY WARWICKSHIRE 19 DEC 2003

which also shows Rugby goalposts with a ball being converted. Both covers show the school crest. On one there is a picture of the game as it was played in the 1800s with the school in the background. On the other there is a modern picture of the school chapel, with William Webb Ellis, credited with initiating the distinctive features of Rugby Football, on the right side.
