### Private Post in New Zealand by Neil Bowlby

In a recent visit and tour of New Zealand, I noticed all along the tourist circuit a new style of stamp only available at all the gift shops, hotels and restaurants. Inquiring, I found the only place that sold regular New Zealand postage stamps was the Post Office. Checking out to find if these tourist style stamps were legal postage, I found the NZ Government had passed legislation deregulating the postal service, effective from April 1, 1998. This allowed full competition in all postal services.

There seems to be several competing c o m p a n i e s offering the same service both in and out of the country. The most noticeable of these companies are Universal Mail NZ, DX Post, Pete's Post.



Fastway Post and Wine Post. The first 3 have the highest profile and greatest acceptance, offering all the products that the Post Office have except banking service and phone cards. This also includes mail boxes, rural route delivery, next day delivery and 2/3 day National delivery. All the cards and letters that we mailed using Universal Mail and DX showed they had been handled through Singapore (labels on cards and envelopes, where all our NZ post mail had no such labels.


The Universal Mail NZ stamps come in booklets of 5 commemoratives, depicting tourism highlights, including 1 round stamp. They issue \$1.50 for postcard mail and \$2.00 for international letter rate. DX mail also offers the same, but also has all the rates the Post Office has. The most peculiar thing is that name New Zealand does not show on any stamp. An acquaintance gave me a baggie of clippings from his hardware store and in it were 3 stamps from Pete's Post, showing us that they are fully

## Stamp Oddities

The open air stamp market in Paris is world famous. Tens of thousands of Parisians and visitors have gone there to buy and swap stamps since the market was established in 1887. The market owes its location to a wealthy landowner who bequeathed the site to Paris in the shadow of the Elysee Palace. A condition of his beguest was that the land be used to benefit all those who shared his passion for stamps. Since then, the market has flourished, remaining open even during occupation and two world wars. The focus today remains firmly on stamps and postal history, just as originally intended. Curiously, the first regular stamp dealer in the market was a woman.

### From the Bookshelf

The Postage Stamps of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, by Nicholas Argenti and published by The Royal Philatelic Society London in 1962. The First Edition was limited to 350 numbered copies. Written in two parts: "The Pence Issues of 1851" and "The Cents Issues of 1860" the book was reported to be a very detailed and comprehensive philatelic study. Of special interest, the author writes of the 1895 selling, by the Nova Scotian government, of the remainder of the stamps and the consequent "mystery" of the value and whereabouts. Bound in green cloth with black and gilt title plate and gilt top edge, the book was illustrated throughout in 23 black and white plates and one colour plate.

Quarterman Publications Inc., of Lawrence, Mass. reprinted the book in 1976 in blue cloth with silver lettering to front. According to Abebooks (www.abebooks.com) an original copy can be purchased for approximately \$200-300 US and a reprint for \$75-125 US. Halifax's J.W. Doull, Bookseller on Barrington St. has a reprinted copy for \$150 CAN.
