#### Young philatelist a rare find among today's generation

[The following article was published in the The Daily News, Halifax Nova Scotia on Sunday, September 18, 2005 – ed.]

Collecting stamps is a sport for 12-year-old Alex Faulkner. His gold ribbon-winning collection at the Novapex annual stamp show and exhibition in Dartmouth this weekend includes more than 100 sport and Olympic-theme stamps.

"I like sports and collect-

ing things, so I thought I'd make a collection," said Faulkner, who spent his summer organizing it for up to three hours a day.

The Lake Echo boy started collecting after his grandfather, David Cooper a longtime philatelist, whose work is also on display - gave him some leftover stamps.

"I'm the only kid at school that collects," said Faulkner, who belongs to the junior Nova Scotia Stamp Club (NSSC). "They (other kids) say, 'Get in the real world.'

"I just say, 'I collect cause I am in the real world.' It's fun. You get to see all the cool-looking stamps and see how much they're worth."

Hundreds came to buy or sell stamps, and check out the exhibits at the Dartmouth Sportsplex yesterday. Happening until 3 p.m. today, the annual show is organized by the

#### NSSC.

There are plenty of interesting exhibits even if you're not a stamp aficionado.

One display traces the history of Horatio Nelson, the British admiral who led his fleet to victory over the French and Spanish 200 years ago at the battle of Trafalgar.

Another display features various Nova Scotian stamps, which date back to the days of pre-Confederation.

There's an exhibit honouring the life of the late Haligonian Henry Hechler, an entrepreneur who helped found a national philatelic society.

There's also an outstanding display of mail by ship in and around the province from the mid-18th to mid-19th century.

Club president John Eldridge said collecting stamps is a good way to learn about geography and history.

"I've learned about the history of countries and places I've never been to," said Eldridge, who also works full-time for Kerr Controls.

For him, stamp collecting is relaxing and a break from every day stresses.

One of the big trends, he said, is topical collecting. People generally go for whatever interests them, including dogs, cats, birds, butterflies, plants, ships, hockey, even Santa Claus.

And with e-mail being quicker than so-called 'snail mail,' used stamps are becoming increasingly rare, said Eldridge. "Modern stamps just aren't as readily available as they used to be."

Now, when you go out to buy them, he said, "you use them, but keep a couple for yourself."

Judging Criteria for One Frame Exhibits

A one frame exhibit develops any aspect of the established competitive Divisions, narrates a complete story of either an issue, stamp, country era, geographic location, or theme or other distinctive concept, and follows a clearly defined title, concept or plan. The criteria are broken down into 4 main categories as discussed below with point allotments shown.

#### 1. Treatment & Significance (30 pts)

Treatment (20 pts) is the degree of development, organization, balance, and completeness, both in the material presented and the story that the exhibit tells.

Significance (10 pts) is the impact the material being presented has on the country, era, location, or theme.

2. Philatelic & Related Knowledge and Personal Study & Research (35 pts)

Philatelic knowledge is demonstrated by the items chosen for the exhibit.

Related knowledge is demonstrated by the accuracy and appropriateness of the related text.

Personal study is demonstrated by proper analysis of the philatelic items.

Research is the presentation of new facts and/or conclusions related to the chosen subject or theme.

#### 3. Condition & Rarity (30 pts)

The material is in the best condition (10 pts) known to exist for the period or type being exhibited.

Rarity (20 pts) is synonymous with difficulty of acquisition and is not synonymous with catalog value.

#### 4. Presentation (10 pts)

The exhibit is neat, clean and pleasing to the eye, and concisely written.

Using the established criteria to discern the points awarded as indicated (total of 100), medal levels are based on the following ranges...

Gold	85 - 100
Vermeil	75 - 84
Silver	65 - 74
Silver-Bronze	60 - 64
Bronze	55 - 59

Currently, NSSC only awards gold, silver and bronze medals. Vermeil is Vermilion or a similar bright red colour but in this context represents gilded silver.


