#### **CLUB SELLERS TABLE**

This is the third bourse in a row that the Nova Scotia Stamp Club has offered it's members a venue for selling articles from their collections. Several hundred dollars have been raised for the Club coffers and you can have some of your philatelic items offered for sale at the show to a broader audience.

Instead of paying a fee for the table, the club sellers each pay 10% of sales to the club. Please submit your items to Hugh Rathbun (hrathbun@hfx.eastlink.ca) to have them displayed on the club sellers table.

Since material from 15 or more sources will be on the same table, it is important to clearly identify your material. Mark each item with the first three letters of your last name along with an item number. Also include an inventory list so that a record of your sales and a record of the unsold items can be maintained.

Material may be submitted up to the opening of the show. Set-up day, Thursday, Aug. 28, would be a good time to deliver it.




**COVER STORY**... This First Day Cover story is a reflection of the Democracy 250 theme of BNAPEX+2008+NOVAPEX.. In 1958, Canada Post issued a stamp (Scott 382) commemorating the 200th anniversary of democratic government which started right here in Nova Scotia. The stamp contains the

Speaker's Chair and Mace, flanked by the year - 1758 - and bilingual text "The first elected assembly of Nova Scotia marked the beginning of our democratic government". The cachets contained themes of scrolls announcing the anniversary, a scene of the first elected assembly, the historic Town Clock, but most prominently are elements or images of the Memorial or "Dingle" Tower. In 1908, Sir Sanford Fleming donated property to the citizens of Halifax for use as a park and proposed the construction of a tower to commemorate the 150th anniversary of representative government in Nova Scotia. The proposed tower was to serve as a memorial to the development of parliamentary institutions in the British Empire.

The plan was accepted by the City of Halifax and the local Canadian Club undertook a fundraising drive to raise money for construction. Donations were received from throughout the British Empire and plaques commemorating the contributions, as well as stones from all of the countries of the Empire were placed on the interior walls.

The items shown here include an unused meter strip depicting the tower and announcing the anniversary. There have been many covers identified with this stamp - all reflecting some aspect of the 200th anniversary, however, these two covers show the tower. The first cover on the right is from RoseCraft and shows the Tower in a graphic and a quote by Water Hines Page. The second, with a picture Memorial Tower, was issued by the Nova Scotia Stamp Club and approved by the Canadian Philatelic Society and the Province of Nova Scotia.





If you have a chance to visit the park during the show - drop by and see the Tower. Be prepared! it is a long <u>walk</u> to the top of the Tower but the view of the Northwest Arm and surroundings is well worth the trip.
