### **October is Stamp Collecting Month**

Stamp collecting began after the introduction of the postage stamp and by the late 1800's was considered a child's hobby. As the children grew up they took their collections more seriously, studying specific aspects of their collection, identifying stamp errors and flaws and writing articles of their findings. A child's hobby became serious business and stamps an investment.

At one time, early in the development and rules of what could be depicted on a stamp, one was more apt to collect stamps with heads of state or royalty. Methods of making and repairing printing plates, the use of variations in the shade of inks, led many collectors to study very narrow subjects and as items became scarce over time their value increased. Today, however, stamp collecting is an adventure in history, geography, science, and a multitude of themes and topics to collect and discuss. Traditional forms of collecting are still prominent but the cost for obtaining material can be prohibitive to new or young collectors.

National Stamp Collecting Month, an annual event that began in 1981 as a joint venture of the Council of Philatelic Organizations and the United States Postal



Service, has spread to nearly every country on the planet. The objective of the Month is to celebrate the most popular hobby in the world and moreover, introduce the "Hobby of Kings" to youth and other new collectors. Pictorial stamps are issued in October to stimulate public interest in the hobby.

The stamps shown at the left were issued by Canada Post in October 2005 commemorating Youth Sports. In fact, each year CP issues a set of stamps in October for

just this purpose and surrounds the launch with a publicity blitz geared towards



y o u n g collectors.



Group Manager, Noel Leahy, says in *Stamp Bulletin*, No, 289 Oct. - Dec. 2007 "As we move on to the last stamp issues for this year we promote the activity of stamp collecting for children in Australia during October with Stamp Collecting Month."

That year AP released two sets of stamps "Fifty Years in Space" and "Caravanning Trough the Years".

Germany celebrates "Stamp Day" (Tag be Briefmarke) every two years with the release of a special semipostal stamp. In 1997, the 440pf+220pf souvenir sheet issue shown here depicts forms of early mail delivery. The additional 220 pf collected is contributed to a foundation promoting the stamp hobby in Germany.

Today's collectors will become tomorrow's philatelists, just like those early collectors of 150 years ago. Plant the seeds of stamp collecting by introducing your young friends to the hobby. Then watch the hobby grow.



#### Longest Running US Sitcom Gets Stamp

Can you name the longest running sitcom in American television? I'll give you a hint - think cartoon. Did you guess the *The Simpsons*? You are right. On January 14, 2010, the show will be twenty years old. In April of this year, the US Postal Service announced that the Simpsons were chosen from amongst 50,000 other stamp subjects suggested by the public. *Simpsons* creator, Matt Groening said: "This is the biggest and most adhesive honour 'The Simpsons' has ever received." The stamps were released in May 2009 with five designs showing the shows leading characters - Homer, Marge, Bart, Lisa and Maggie Simpsons. The stamps

## Cover Story - 1840 Redirected Penny Black Mail by Michael Peach

The folded lettersheet is an early example of a redirected letter. It is from a lawyer at 21 Regent Street, Liverpool, and concerns a property purchase by the late Sir Henry Crewe. It was mailed at Regent Street, Liverpool on 30 OC 1840, to Sir George Crewe, the son of Sir Henry, at his residence, Calke Abbey, near Ticknall, Derbyshire, and was received the next day in Derby, OC 31 1840. Calke Abbey is now a National Trust property. It was subsequently redirected to another of his residences, Tattingstone Place, near Ipswich. At this time, redirection was considered as having been mailed again, and the postage had to be paid again. The forwarding fee, 1d, was paid by cash on NO 3, probably at (Ticknall) Derby Post Office. The penny black is from plate 4 and has a red Maltese Cross cancellation.
