THE MACHINS 2022

This year, 2022, in Canada as well as Great Britain there have been new issues of the iconic Machins, first issued in 1970.

A new era in British philately occurred in February when Royal Mail issued four self-adhesive low value Machin definitive stamps, first and second class, and first and second class large, with barcodes. The corresponding non-barcoded stamps will become invalid on 31 January 2023. A trial 2nd class stamp had been issued on 23 March 2021. The low value 2021 Christmas stamps, 2nd and 1st had been issued with and without barcodes and 2nd and 1st class Large only with barcodes. There are new colours. Each stamp has a unique barcode, QR, that will be used to track the letter. The stamps are larger than the current first and second class Machins. The two parts of the stamp are separated by a simulated perforation line. The stamp design and the simulated perforation are printed in gravure, the barcode is digitally printed. The stamps also have the appropriate phosphor bands. The bar code is unique to the specific stamp and when the system is fully operational it will ensure that the stamp cannot be reused and its progress through the system can be monitored.

We await developments, are more barcoded Machin definitive and special stamps scheduled? None of the new issues so far this year, Rolling Stones, Queens' Jubilee and David Gentleman have barcoded stamps.

The Canadian stamp issued to mark the Queen's Platinum Anniversary, uses the Machin image for the first time on a Canadian stamp.

Other countries have started issuing barcoded stamps, such as the Brazil stamp shown in my article about The Insulin Centenary in the December 2021 Post. Germany also issued some barcoded stamps last year.

Will Canada be giving the 'P' stamps bar codes? I notice that printed stamps with small barcodes are used by Canada Post Details and many charity mailings.

DISTRICT DEAD LETTER OFFICE 1 - NEW HANDSTAMP - DLO # 69

37 mm diameter, sans-serif, all mixed. No proof known Not all First Day Covers are straightforward. Some end up being very interesting and can have rare hand-stamps on them.

This registered Artcraft First Day cover from Ottawa to New York was marked Undeliverable... after three notices for delivery had been applied. Ultimately, the cover was marked UNCLAIMED and RETURNED TO SENDER. On March 23 1948 a New York Reg'y, Div. handstamp indicates when the cover was returned to the Canadian postal system. It was received in Ottawa on MR 24 1948.

With no return address, it was sent to the Ottawa District Dead Letter Office as indicated by the '1' circle handstamp on APR 2 1948.

The RARE item comment comes into play with this District Dead Letter Office 1 circle handstamp. There is a similar handstamp with a dash between Ottawa, - Ont., and 'Ont.' as the key difference. This item is the only Ottawa DLO handstamp with 'Ontario.' spelled out.

Thus, a newly reported handstamp.

NS Stamp Club c/o Jeff Parks 102 Birch Bear Run, Lewis Lake, NS B3Z 4B8 May 1, 1893 cheque ordering the Manager of the Bank of Montreal to pay C.J. Macdonald Esq. P.O.I., the sum of thirty-five cents for "expressage paid on box containing P.O. property from Lorne, N.S. April 3, 1893." It is signed by the Deputy Postmaster General, Wm. White, at Ottawa. Black ink 'UNDER TEN DOLLARS' was added to cheque. Lt. Col. C.J. Macdonald was Post Office Inspector for Nova Scotia from 1878 until his death in 1903, with a brief hiatus in 1885 when he served with the Halifax Rifles during the Northwest Rebellion.



As for the contents of the box, J.J. MacDonald cites in his article on remainders (BNA Topics Jan-Feb 1985 Vol. 42 No. 1) an April 21, 1880 letter from C.J. Macdonald that obsolete postage stamps were to be forwarded to Ottawa in registered boxes.

The delightful message from Finley Beaton (Archie) is a request for two bulls, two years old, thoroughbred, sired Shorthorn Durham and Ayrshire, to be sent to Mabou Station about May 1st.



CBC Stamp Club of the Air, 1950 to 1975 (for children)

Hosted by Douglas Patrick, assisted by Mary Patrick, the club met on CBC Radio for 15 minutes (12:30 to 12:45 EST) every Saturday for twenty-five years. For membership one submitted 10 cents and, in return, received a pin, a package of 50 different stamps, a 'guide to stamp collecting' booklet and a membership number.

Doug Patrick worked at the Globe and Mail in advertising.

He was a wellknown philatelist and member of Philatelic Specialists Society of Canada (PSSC). He and his wife, Mary, published ten books on stamp collecting, and he authored a stamp column in the Globe for thirty three years. He produced over a thousand scripts for the CBC Stamp Club. A frequent guest was the late Michael Madesker RDP FRPSC, a distinguished philatelist and a great proponent of youth philately, and whose contributions to organized Canadian philately are monumental.


