QUEEN ELIZABETH II (1926-2022)

Queen Elizabeth II (b. April 21, 1926) died on September 8, 2022. Having served as Queen since February 6, 1952, her reign of 70 years and 214 days was the longest of any British monarch. The Queen, like her father, was a stamp collector and Royal Patron of the Royal Philatelic Society in London.




With her death, the United Kingdom as well as some Commonwealth countries will see a transition in their currency and stamps with the image of King Charles III replacing the Queen's image. Some countries have announced that stamps will be issued commemorating the life of Queen Elizabeth II. On November 10, 2022, the Royal Mail will issue four stamps (below). In addition, the following issues have been announced without a set date of

issue: Antigua and Barbuda (5 stamp souvenir sheet); Grenada (6 stamp souvenir sheet); Grenada (8 stamp souvenir sheet); Guyana (4 stamp souvenir sheet); Marshall Islands (6 stamp souvenir sheet); Nevis (5 stamp souvenir sheet); Papua New Guinea (6 stamp souvenir sheet); Saint Vincent and the Grenadines (5 stamp souvenir sheet); The Gambia (5 stamp souvenir sheet); and Tuvalu (4 stamp souvenir sheet). Both France and Malta issued stamps on September 19, 2022 in memory of Queen Elizabeth.



D.L.O 3 ✕ CIRCLE SHIFT HANDSTAMP - DLO SERIES #73

Elusive is not strong enough a term for me to use about obtaining this cover. I have known about it for decades as it is used on the front of Brian Plain's **The Dead Letter Office in Canada 1830-2002: An Illustrated Postal History**. This cover has all the key elements of a DLO item due to everything being on the front and includes the only known strike of the #3 circle shift handstamp.

Originally mailed from Chateauguay Bassin, L.C. on NO 24 1875, handstamps **OVER ½ OZ.** and **RETURNED – FOR / POSTAGE** were applied and then sent to the DLO in Ottawa.

At the time short-paid covers sent to the DLO were required to obtain additional postage.

circle shift handstamp (assuming evening shift from 12 a.m. to 8 a.m.) was applied. The manuscript **155** on the left is a file number to find the item once payment from the addressee has been obtained. Nicely attached is a three cent Small Queen dated with a DLO split ring handstamp JA 24 1976, then placed into the regular mail stream.

Of note for this #3 Shift handstamp is the 'D' pointing upwards, and the dots '•' in between each letter, similarly done for the #1 and #2 circle shift handstamps. Later, once enough representative pieces have been obtained for study, it was clear either replacement handstamps or a new set were issued.

Shown is a separate cover from 1888. The 'D' is now pointing to the right and there are

no dots in between the letters 'D L O'.

One could assume the dots wore out and disappeared. However, the change of the letter 'D' switching direction proves the use of separate set of handstamps.

NATIONAL STAMP DAY 1974

National Stamp Day was celebrated on 6 May 1974, the 134th anniversary of the penny black. A Festival of Stamps exhibition was held at the Royal Festival Hall, London from 3 to 6 May 1974. Souvenir sheets were produced with the octagonal Machins which were valid for postage. These stamps were only available on postal stationery. The sheet shown has compound stamping of light blue ½p and blue 3p octagonal Machins for the first-class rate on 6 May 1974. As the special stamped to order service had ceased on 31 October 1973, the stamps had been cut out from a postal stationery envelope. There is no gum. The sheet was prepared for Rush Stamps. It was designed by Michael Clarke and litho-printed by The



House of Questa.

In the 1970s Rush Stamps produced several other souvenir sheets, that are not listed in a catalogue. Celebrating National Stamp Day is not on the calendar of major philatelic events.

I recently acquired this Royal Train cover on eBay from a seller in Edmonton. I purchased it primarily for the cachet. I am working a collection of first day covers featuring stamps which depict Princess Elizabeth (1932-1951). The cover is "autographed" by a Hugo L. Black. The cover is addressed in pencil to a J. Simons, who I have been told was a dealer in Toronto at the time. The only Hugo Black of note that I have found, is an American, who was a US senator from Alabama from 1927 - to 1937, and then appointed an associate justice of the U.S. supreme court from 1937 to 1971. Do any of you 1939 Royal Visit / Royal Train collectors out there have any idea why this cover would have been signed? Does anyone have access to an itinerary of the Royals visit to the US, events or receptions where Justice Black might have met the King or Queen?
